- Medical assistance - particularly mental health
- Legal aid/support
- Help with new mothers - clothes, formula, diapers, etc.
- Providing or finding a jobs where their clients can make a living wage and still care for their families
- Provide transportation to appointments, grocery store, DMV
- Donate gift cards, toiletries, home goods, etc.
- Ministry of presence
