## NOTE ABOUT THE PROGRAM

We begin this Palm Sunday with all the usual pomp and pageantry: festive brass resounding, palm branches waving, children processing, loud hosannas singing!

Yet we all know that the excitement of the procession will turn toward tragedy in just a few short days. Today, we consider the familiar encounter between Pilate and Jesus that initiates this tragedy, an exchange in which Jesus appeals not to earthly power or might, but to a 'power given from above.'

With the help of seasoned spiritual writers, poets, and saints, and musicians of all stripes, we ponder today how this unlikely power might be available to each of us, just as it was to Jesus. Could it be that this divine communion that Jesus uncovered is ours to discover as well? Could it be that Jesus' way of life and death is the very pattern that we are mercifully and gracefully offered now, day by day, long before we physically die?

We stumble upon God's primary hiding place when we surrender, when we stop clinging to our own small reality and fall into the One reality, the spaciousness of God. We find real power in relinquishing control, real grounding in letting go of all we've known. This is the message of the cross. The cross urges us, by God's grace, to steal away to Christ, to radically surrender to the God-given depths of our lives, to let go of all that obscures the true power available in each moment.

The path of the cross is ours to experience. Radical surrender—stealing away—leads us into new life, making available a 'power given from above,' where salvation is now, and heaven is here.

## Children

Children of all ages are welcome and encouraged to participate in worship. Worship materials for ages 3-12 are available in the Narthex outside the Sanctuary.

- **0-24 months:** During all services, a nursery is provided for infants through toddlers in Room 113 and is staffed by trained, professional child care workers and volunteer helpers.
- **Ages 2 years old-5th Grade:** Church school is offered in conjunction with worship at 9:30am and 11am in Rooms 105, 111, and 107. If you would like for your children to attend Church School, please fill out a Child Sign-In Card and send it with them at the Welcoming the Children time in worship. \*
- **Grades K-5:** During our 11am service, elementary students are invited to Room 106 to participate in JAMS (Junior Arts and Music on Sundays) which engages kids in singing, drama, percussion, and more.

\*Please note that on the first Sunday of the month we do not have Church School for children. We encourage all children to attend worship, so they can participate in communion with their faith community. Alternatively, our nursery will still be available for babies—4 years old in Room 113, and JAMS will still be offered for Grades K-5 at 11am in Room 106.

## Youth

Youth grades 6-12 meet in Room 100 at 11am on Sunday mornings. New youth are welcome. On the fourth Sunday of each month, the youth lead our "Dial Up" service at 11am in the Chapel.
